On May 20-22, North America's Building Trades Unions will host its annual Labor of Love Tournament in Baltimore, Maryland. This signature event supports the efforts of the Diabetes Research Institute (DRI) and its mission to find a cure for this debilitating disease. To date, our efforts have helped raise more than \$53 million dollars for DRI. Our affiliated unions, our owner and contractor partners, and our vendors and sponsors have been involved in the Fight for a Cure for the past 30 years, and without our support, this cure-focused research might not be at the threshold it is now.

For the last several years, we have endeavored to keep you abreast of the medical advancements being made by the DRI. Last May, we shared with you the progress on the DRI BioHub, a bioengineered mini organ that mimics the pancreas, and we introduced you to a woman who was the first patient in the BioHub clinical trials. Remarkably, she no longer needs insulin therapy to control her blood sugars. Then in June, the same innovative BioHub protocol was duplicated by DRI collaborators, resulting in another patient being freed from insulin injections. These clinical trials will continue with additional patients in the coming year.

Because of your support for the Labor of Love program, we are in the midst of seeing a cure become a reality, and we can all take pride in that.

Thank you again for being a part of our efforts over the years. And for those of you who are considering partnering with us for the first time in our Fight for a Cure, we thank you and look forward to seeing you in Baltimore in May.
