Kim joined the apprenticeship program of Local Union 846 in June 2011 at the age of 40 as a single mother of 5; two of her sons as well as her younger sister followed in her footsteps and are now Journeyworkers. She is the first female to complete and graduate from the four-year program. She earned her Journeyworker status in May 2014. Kim has been working in the field since 2013 at Nuclear Plant Vogtle in Waynesboro, Georgia. This is one of the most high-profile jobs for Local Union 846. Kim became the first female Steward for our Local in July 2017, replacing a long-standing male Steward. As a Steward, Kim has done an outstanding job representing the Local as well as her Brothers & Sisters. In 2017 Kim represented Local Union 846 at the Women Build Nations Conference in Chicago.

Kim was nominated in the 2020 Elections to the Executive Committee of Local Union 846 and she became the first female member of the board. Local Union 846 is very proud of all the firsts for Kim within our Local.

In a male dominated field, Kim has shown to be strong and focused. Her achievements haven't been handed to her, she has earned



every single one through hard work and determination.
