Bio

Veronica Leal has been a union member of IUPAT District Council 14 for 29 years, Local 265. She is a full-time instructor at the DC 14 Apprenticeship Program from December 2016 to present. She is grateful for the privilege and honor to be able to train future apprentices and journey-level upgrade classes. She had 23 years in the field before having the opportunity to educate at the DC14 Apprenticeship Program.

The American Dream of a 16-year-old female Hispanic immigrant in this country, born in Mexico, who couldn't speak English, read, or write, would seemingly limit her chances of a successful career.

She attended Atterbury Job Corps Center Job 1991 waiting for a position to open in the union paint shop. After completing that in 1993, she started her new career with IUPAT/PDC14 Apprenticeship School.

She has assisted in helping wallcovering manufacturers create installation guidelines for new products and helped them resolve existing installation issues, she has aided in developing, and endorsed training for materials.

She also educates members in special finishes, wood grain classes, and teaching



safety classes in Spanish. She has extensive knowledge of this trade.

Veronica has taken the previous wallcovering curriculum and structure to the next level of education, growth, and knowledge for the current and next generation. Over the last 6 years, she has been invited to train the trainers in several wallcovering classes throughout the IUPAT industry.

A first-generation painter in her family paved the way. She is the first female Instructor at the DC 14 Apprenticeship Program.

She was and is very enthusiastic and instrumental in helping:
